Equal Rights for Women: A Fallacy in the Art World?

Please join us for a panel discussion with Joyce Owens, Kymberly N. Pinder, Ph.D., and Daniel Schulman about the state of equality for women artists in the art world.

The panel considers what race and gender have to do with "making it" as an artist in the 21st Century. Practically every other discipline in the world: politics, media, corporate, science and technology, has shown extensive progress regarding significant participation by people of color and women, but in the world of art, when it comes to major exhibitions, directing major art institutions and gaining major prestige and prices for their art work, women, in general, and women of color seem to have lower numbers. The discussion will include a presentation by the panel, followed by an exchange with the audience about these issues, possible solutions, and reality.

Joyce Owens, Artist, Curator of the Galleries Program at Chicago State University, Art Instructor; BFA, Howard University, MFA, Yale University. Owens' award winning work has been exhibited internationally. Ragdale Fellow Joyce Owens blogs, curates, juries and consults on art.

Kymberly N. Pinder, Associate Professor, School of the Art Institute of Chicago, Art History, Theory and Criticism; BA, cum laude, Middlebury College, MA; MPhil, and PhD, Yale University.

Daniel Schulman, Independent Art Historian and Curator with over twenty-five years of experience at The Museum of Modern Art, the Metropolitan Museum of Art, and the Art Institute of Chicago, where he was Assistant and Associate curator of modern and contemporary art from 1993 to 2004. The Chicago native has a BA, Columbia University in New York and MA, New York University's Institute of Fine Arts.
